

More clean-up campaigns are in the pipeline; hence, stakeholders willing to take part and partner, as we move to imprint a positive face-lift on the earth for future generations.



Discover your learning style

10 Tips for studying 1. Pick a place and time

The best time and place to study varies for everyone, some prefer their bedroom or dormitory at night or the library after school, get a study spot and time that works for you and maintain it.

This study space should be quiet, comfortable and distraction free. It should please and inspire you. Decorate it in a manner that gives you inspiration using objects or picture. Some prefer the accompanying music in the background, just pick a space that lets you be yourself and do that.

Some people work better early in the morning while others prefer the night. Suit yourself and plan to study then. Don't study much later in the night that you deny yourself enough time for sleep. You may get weary to study.

2. Study every day

If you study a little bit every day, you'll be continually reviewing things in your mind. This helps you understand things. It also helps you avoid the stress of last-minute cramming.

Early in the year an hour or two a night might be enough to stay on top of things. Later in the year you might need to study more each day.

If you're finding it hard to find time to study, cut back on some (but not all!) of your other activities. Prioritizing study might mean spending less time online, or it might mean cutting back on shifts at work suppose you are on block, or giving weekend sport a miss for a while.

3. Plan your time

It helps to have some plans in motion so you can make the most of your study time.

Setting alarms to remind you about your study plans. A regular reminder keeps you honest and your plans on track. Suppose you are an early reader, they handy in waking you up.

Stick a calendar or wall weekly planner up so you can see it whenever you're studying. Mark it up with important dates, like exams and assignment due dates. Use it to block out your regular study timetable too.

Listing your work breaks it down to sizes and amounts that you can manage. Beginning your week, list all the things you need to achieve by the end of the week. Daily study session should also follow the same format where e you list the topics and objectives you ought to finish at the end of each study session.

Break your time for each activity that you wish to accomplish during your study, you may utilize the timer on this one as well to ensure you stick to your plan. If you don't get something done in the

set time, consider whether it's the best use of your time to keep going with it, or to start working on something else.

4. Discover your learning style

Most of us have a preferred way of learning. Get to know the learning style you're most comfortable with and study in the ways you learn best.

Note that these styles are just a way to think about different studying techniques – they're not hard and fast rules that say you should only study in one way. Try each of these out and see which ways you prefer.

Auditory learners prefer to learn by listening. Try reading your notes aloud and discussing them with other people. You might like to record key points and play them back.

Visual learners prefer to learn by seeing. Try using colors in your notes and draw diagrams to help represent key points. You could try to remember some ideas as images.

Tactile/kinesthetic learners prefer to learn by doing. Try using techniques like role-playing or building models to revise key points.

5. Review and revise

At least once a week you should revise what you've studied in class. Thinking things over can help you to understand the concepts and help you remember when you need them the most.

Quiz – Get a friend or family member to quiz you on key concepts. Offer to help your friends with their work too. Quizzes are great ways to get confident about what you know and find out what you still need to learn.

Make your own study materials – Think up some practice exam questions or create your own flash cards to help you study. This way you learn it all twice: once when you make the study materials and once when you use them to revise.

Mock Teach-take time to teach your siblings or study mates about the the concepts you have read, it will show your level understanding while benefiting your study mate who is listening too

6. Take breaks

It's important to take breaks while you're studying, especially if you're feeling tired or frustrated. Working too long on a task can actually decrease your performance.

When you take a break, make sure you get away from your desk or study space. A bit of physical – even just a walk around the block – can sometimes help you to look at a problem in a

different perspective and could even help you to solve it.

7. Ask for help

If you're stuck on something, or something just doesn't seem to make sense, you can always ask for help. Talk to your teachers or lecturers about the things you don't understand. Talk to your friends and fellow students too.

8. Stay motivated

When you're studying it helps to keep in mind your reasons for doing all this hard work, like a course or career you're working towards. It can help to have something in your study space to remind you of your goals.

You could also decorate your study space with inspirational quotes or photos of people you admire and family members you want to make proud of you.

9. App it up

There are heaps of apps out there for helping students with all aspects of study. Have a chat with your friends and teachers or lecturers to see which apps they recommend.

10. Look after yourself

You'll study better if you take care of yourself. Make sure you eat well and get enough sleep and physical exercise. Don't reward yourself with too many sugary or fatty snacks or push yourself to study late into the night. It's also a good idea to make sure you drink lots of water when you're studying.

Now come up with your own strategies

These tips are only some of the things you can do to get the most out of your studying. You might already have other things that work better for you. Find out what your friends do when they're studying. Maybe your teachers have some good recommendations too.

Whatever it is, whatever strategy you come up with, when you find something that works for you, put it into practice and go for it!

a pillar for compliance, policy-making, and education regulation in Zimbabwe

ZEGU represented in social work at national levels

THE Chairman of The Zimbabwe Ezekiel Guti University (ZEGU) Department of Social Work has been co-opted to become a member of the Education, Regulation & Enforcement Committee of the National Association of Social Workers Zimbabwe, a pillar for compliance, policy-making, and education regulation in Zimbabwe, due to the chairperson's past experience in Social Work.

This development is a positive move, considering that ZEGU has a Social Work degree, as one of its main programs. It will go a long way in creating platforms for students who will graduate from the University in social work.

The chairman's experience in the Social Work Department will add to the learner's experience and knowledge; hence, the ZEGU's mission of producing a complete person will be met, through co-optation.

The Council consists of nine board members, who are responsible for policy formulation. These members are subdivided into three (3) subcommittees responsible for the implementation of the council pillars: External Stakeholders Engagements, Finance, and Program Development Committee, Education, Regulation and Enforcement Committee, and Audit and Disciplinary Committee.

Through the Education, Regulation, and Enforcement Committee, Council has the power to co-opt special members into these 3 committees in terms of the Social Workers Act 27:21 (Sec.18 (2B).

Co-opted members must be professionals with requisite skills with an interest in the development of social work.

National Association of Social Workers Zimbabwe was established in 1968, it joined the IFSW in 1986. It is a voluntary professional body for Social Workers in Zimbabwe. The association provides its members with a platform to network, share experience, and improve their competencies to deliver services.

NASWZ acts as a mouthpiece for the social work profession in Zimbabwe. The association is a registered Trust and is contributing towards the improvement of human welfare, through development projects and social research.

It helps in evidence-based interventions to alleviate poverty and social ills. The association also plays a critical role in promoting the importance of human relations, social and economic equalities. Good relations between social workers themselves will create an opportunity for sharing of experiences and mentorship. They are the Centre for responding to the effects of economic strife, poverty, unemployment and disasters.








NEW AT ZEGU?

leave the fear behind because..

Five ways to keep your anxiety low while transitioning to ZEGU

When I first applied for a degree program at Zimbabwe Ezekiel Guti University, I had purposed in my heart to learn at an institution that could not only feed my mind but my soul and spirit too. My deepest fear somehow was that after years of procrastinating to enroll in a degree program, will I see it through this time? Worse with unpredictable times prevailing in the world. Will I be able to attain academic excellence learning unpredictably, as Covid-19 induced lockdowns to continue to dominate our lives and productivity? Would online learning be sufficient, will I manage it? These and a lot of other questions characterized my meditation. I can say that now that I am too deep in academics, let me share my coping experience to help the next brother.

One year has passed since the declaration of a global pandemic and how we live, and work has changed. With the disruption in our lives, we have had to learn many new technologies on how to engage and communicate with each other, and I completely understand the last thing anyone wants to be doing right now is to grasp yet another Learning Management System (LMS). This write is meant to give you how I managed my anxiety fitting into the Zimbabwe Ezekiel Guti University (ZEGU) learning program and activities during the global pandemic.



Takeaway #1: Start by keeping it simple

You might be feeling like there is a lot of information thrown your way about virtual learning, e-learning, and student portals all that jargon to do with internet-based solutions and you are correct. You don't need to know it all right away, but you need to start somewhere. For me, it was easiest to follow the KISS principle – Keep It Simple and Straightforward. My plan book and laptop-based planner included the basics: an application for each week, a calendar section to keep track of seminar and assignment dates, as well as pinned WhatsApp groups and contacts for students to easily contact me and quick reception of group assignments information and updates.

Takeaway #2: When in doubt, draw it out

While keeping with the KISS principle, I went old school and took out my trusty pen and paper. I drew out what I wanted each week to look like, as a webpage, which included my must-haves (an overview of readings, accessible link to each online lecture, seminar information, and a discussion board). Once I had this image in mind, I was able to clearly lay out a template that I used from week to week.

Pro tip: It is best to have your course outline finished before jumping into the organization of your course page. If you begin too early, you will likely end up re-doing a lot of your work.

Takeaway #3: *Get creative*

One thing I appreciate about the ZEGU student portal is its simplicity and easy to manoeuvre outlook. I was able to get creative by utilizing the screenshot feature of my laptop to be able to go over the basics off-site.

Takeaway #4: Experiment

Once I started to feel a bit more comfortable with the portal, I was able to experiment and play around with more features. I experimented with e-books and a lot more, search features to find more than just my line of learning. However, there are a lot of other cool features to experiment with too!

If planned correctly, Brightspace can be a very intuitive system. One pro and con of the student portal is that you can add a link to access content in multiple places. If you are signed in on the student portal, whatever academic you search on your browser, ZEGU recommended articles, e-books, and reading material will appear. My experience has been that this is beneficial to some, as students will likely find it easier, but also challenging for others as they experience needing to 'click' around more to find something.

Takeaway #5: *Have no fear*

Wherever you are on your journey to learning, leave the fear behind because the student e-library has you covered. They have resources available, such as e-books and academic papers, as well as support. So, despite the distance, let's learn from and share with each other to master this new system together.

Learning a new experience doesn't have to be a painful experience. My hope is that you can take comfort in the ease of my experience, while also learning a few tips from my takeaways. I can't wait to hear from others about their own takeaways.

THE ORDER OF MUNHUMUTAPA

Selfless leader Prof. Ezekiel Handinawangu Guti honoured

From this list; then comes the Order of the Star, along with the order of Great Zimbabwe, Order of merit, which involves military and civil honour and the order of Munhumutapa.

Orders mentioned above are classified as of National Order; there are other categories as Bravery Awards, Service Awards, as well as commemorative awards.

He has made a measurable impact over the past 70-years, as a passionate advocate for selflessness, excellence, entrepreneurship and developing a total person by feeding the body and spirit.

His leadership qualities are as varied as his skills, and they include: caring for the vulnerable, provision of education, human capital development, public health and missionary work. 
