FSNTC will now act as the watchdog and mouthpiece of female students, while also conscientising students on various issues such as sexual harassment, the Cyber Security Bill, and a host of other important issues.


The 21st October 2022 will witness the orientation of the body's executive paving the way for the establishment to commence operations.

ZEGU introduces Lifelong College



THE Zimbabwe Ezekiel Guti University (ZE-GU)'s recently launched College of Lifelong Learning is geared to have a lasting impression on communities through the provision of skills-based learning that will equip individuals with the requisite knowledge on development.

ZEGU's College of Lifelong Learning has a catalogue of more than 60 Certificate and Diploma programmes that will be administered by the institution from the onset of the first Semester of this year.

Speaking in an interview with the NGAONE news crew, ZEGU Pro-Vice Chancellor, Professor Innocent Chirisa, expressed optimism at the success of the initiative given its core mandate of building communities and its vast portfolio of programmes at the exposal of students.

"It (College of Lifelong Learning) is structured as the seventh (7th) Faculty of the university in which various Certificates and Diplomas are offered, and these impart very important skills to the individuals, which also impact on the local communities.

"We offer Certificates in Stewardship, Financial Management, Auditing, Project Planning (implementation, monitoring and evaluation), and these also shape into various Diplomas which people can study within a year and a half," said Prof. Chirisa.

He added: "Once students acquire Diplomas, they can as well go towards registering for Degrees within ZEGU and elsewhere."

One of the most interesting aspects of the College of Lifelong Learning is that modules cumulatively lead to Diploma programmes.

Among many other aspects, the ZEGU College of Lifelong Learning will seek to focus on the vocational and skills dimensions of lifelong learning; recognise the complexity and multi-dimensional nature of the challenges faced by humanity calls for the restoration of a holistic vision of learning throughout life; make lifelong learning the governing principle of education policy and to offer people opportunities to learn throughout life, whatever their background or context, and proffer flexible learning options including online and distance learning, night and weekend courses, Summer University and Certificates and Diplomas, respectively, amongst a host of other beneficial issues.

Already, a number of enquiries have been successfully converted to enrollment have been recorded across country, as the nation warms up to the new game changer.

Both young and middle-aged prospective students have shown a keen interest in the initiative.

This represents good fortunes for the institution, as restructuring will edify the institution in terms of increasing enrollment figures and also mean an increase in our staffing numbers, especially in the academic arm.

ZEGU remains committed to recruiting professional lecturers and non-teaching staff at all costs so as to continue improving the brand of the institution which is continually getting rave reviews on a variety of formal and non-for mal platforms. This is justified by the corporate sector's continued association and confidence in the brand and sponsor.

It is also prudent that we take this opportunity to congratulate the visionary and founder of ZEGU, Chancellor Professor Ezekiel Handinawangu Guti, as it is this year that the institution marked its 10th Anniversary, a milestone which was achieved through faith and hard work from employees anchored by the support from the sponsor and our valued stakeholders.

IN its efforts to bring education to the door step of marginalised communities, the Zimbabwe Ezekiel Guti University (ZEGU) is embarking on a spirited enrollment outreach that will see visits to Chitungwiza, Chipinge and Chiredzi materialising.

It has been long-time coming for the Chancellor Professor Ezekiel Handiwangu Guti-led institution having made initial contact with the Chipinge and Chiredzi communities (on education matters) almost a year ago, a move which saw hundreds of prospective students preregistering for enrollment.

However, God's time is the best and true to that, the ZEGU teams are preparing for a cross country outreach, with Chitungwiza, Chiredzi and Chipinge being the destinations after being previously identified as Districts where the university stands good ground of establishing learning centres.

This will enable staff members to meet and interact with school leavers and even the working-class on which programmes they can enrol for during the on-going March & August 2023 Intake.

Those willing to further their education have been dealt a great treat, as ZEGU has already introduced a number of Masters programmes namely, Master of Arts in Theology and Religious Studies; Master of Science in Development Studies; Master of Education Leadership and Management; Master of Education in Psychology, and the Master of Education in Sociology, respectively.

With a number of developments in the institution already reported on, the establishment of the LifeLong College will certainly standout as a life-line for people in local communities to further their education.

Hence; communities of Chitungwiza, Chipinge and Chiredzi can ride on the newly introduced Lifelong College, which the ZEGU Pro-Vice Chancellor Professor Innocent Chirisa coined "... a vehicle, through which ZEGU brings to local communities the aspect of learning..., for personal development."

Thousands who might have failed to make the required grades for higher education, as there is a plethora of Certificates that prospective students can choose from and enroll.

Momentum is already high at the targeted sites with some prospective students from praising the institution for remembering their communities.

Restructuring exercise to spur ZEGU's growth trajectory

The Zimbabwe Ezekiel Guti University (ZEGU) has embarked on an ambitious restructuring programme that will see the higher education institution offering over 200 Undergraduate and Postgraduate degree programmes, Registrar Mr. Innocent Chinyemba has said.

The restructuring is in line with the implementation of Education 5.0. The University Senate with the concurrence of the University Council has approved the restructuring of the existing faculties and the creation of other faculties to bring the total number of faculties to six (6).

The restructuring exercise will see the formation of new faculties like the Faculty of Law, Business Intelligence, and Economics being headed by Dean Dr Ellen Sithole; Faculty of Engineering, Health and Veterinary Services (Dean yet to be announced); Faculty of Artefactual Design and Futures (Acting Dean) Professor Innocent Chirisa; Faculty of Education, Governance, Theology and Leadership headed by Dean Dr Godfrey Jakachira; Faculty of Science Technology, Agriculture and Food Systems Development headed by (Acting Dean) Justin Makota, and the Faculty of Heritage, Humanities and Societal Advancement headed by Dean Dr William Muchono, respectively.

Commenting on the restructuring exer-

cise that is set to take effect from the 1st December 2022, Reg. Chinyemba said the exercise was in line with Government dictates.

"The Restructuring is meant to align the University Faculties, Departments and Degree Programmes to the dictates of the Ministry-approved Heritage Based Education 5.0 philosophy.

"Restructuring has resulted in the unbundling of the existing 4 Faculties to the creation of 6 Faculties.

"The intention is to develop over 200 Undergraduate and Postgraduate degree programmes between now and August 2023 that we will submit to ZIMCHE (Zimbabwe Council for Higher Education) for Accreditation," he said.

Previously, ZEGU had only four faculties namely the Faculty of Law; Faculty of Health, Sciences and Technology; Faculty of Business, Economics and Accounting, and the Faculty of Humanities, Education and Social Sciences, respectively.

With the new faculties expected to usher new programmes at the Bindura-based university, enrollment levels are expected to increase.

Chinyemba expressed optimism about the university's state of preparedness for an influx of students, come the year 2023.

"We have guaranteed financial support to gradually increase the teaching and learning facilities as we roll over the Restructuring exercise.

"Currently we have reassigned the Faculty Deans that were presiding over the old Faculties to the newly established Faculties as stated earlier," added Chinyemba.

ZEGU is one of Zimbabwe's fastest-rising higher education institutions. The university recently held its 6th graduation ceremony, where over 400 Graduands were capped by Chancellor Professor Ezekiel Guti, this September.

The university has established a well-to-do campus in Harare, and learning centres in Chitungwiza, Chipinge and Chiredzi, respectively.

"The news of having an institution of the magnitude of ZEGU in our community is of great importance, especially for us (youths), who have just finished their A' level studies. 
Some of the key take-away lessons include: Failing to work with others is also planning to fail the project; Impress the funder; Take time to plan what you are writing about; Have proper

ZELSA president flies ZEGU's flag high in Amsterdam




It won't be a surprise to see the ZEGU

Green BuildingS, panacea to climate change fight

GREENING and adaptation of sustainable energy sources is a sure way of winning the climate change fight, Green Building Council of Zimbabwe (GBCZ) Board member and Zimbabwe Ezekiel Guti University (ZEGU) Pro-Vice Chancellor Professor Innocent Chirisa, has said.

Responding to a plethora of congratulatory messages upon his appointment to the Green Building Council of Zimbabwe (GBCZ), Prof Chirisa opined that the time for action was now; hence, the nation and individuals should prioritise sustainable energy. "...In environmental studies, greatest enemy the sustainability is especially carbon in the air. It must be managed, if not put under our feet; hence, carbon sequestration.

"As we speak, the earth is warming up fast and furious. "Greening is about making sure that vegetation is planted or kept acting as carbon sinks. Secondly, it is about advocating for cleaner energy use – wind, solar amongst a host of other sources," said Prof. Chirisa. With an estimated 40 per-

cent (%) of global warming emanating from the construction and building sector, Governments across the globe have been called to action, as the scourge of climate change continues to threaten human existence.

Prof Chirisa implored construction firms and individuals to be climate conscious when going about their chores, so as to minimise the negative impacts of climate change, which are mostly human made.

"The subject is about managing climate change impacts. When we build, we can imagine how many trees we destroy to burn just the bricks. How much heat is needed to produce any material that you see on that building you are moving out of or getting into?," he added.

Speaking in an interview with publication, Alexander Millin, immediate past president of Real Estate Institution Zimbabwe president bemoaned the slow uptake of green buildings by the conbut, struction, however, expressed optimism given trends transpiring in the sector. "The uptake (green buldings construction) has been slow. However, over the last five

years there has been some renewed interest in this phenomenon.

"In my opinion, to the following; a lack of awareness on the benefits of the use of green building technology; incertitude as to the effectiveness and efficiencies that could be derived from the adoption of such technology, and implementation costs," opined Millin.

He added that despite the slow uptake of green buildings in the construction sector, players in the sector remain committed to see through the transition.

"Yes, there is a push for going the "green building way". However, more needs to be done through regular awareness programmes for all stakeholders in the built environment," he added.

According to the real estate expert, approximately 10 percent of Harare's buildings are already green buildings.

"It is encouraging to note that approximately 20 – 25% of the older buildings are in the process of retrofitting green building technology, especially in renewable energy such as solar. This includes implementation of recycling of materials in particular, grey water," said Millin.

Recently, ZEGU lived to its promise of carrying about its duties to the community by following up the solarisation of the Bindura campus by installing solar power at its Harare campus, as the institution goes green and has its say on the climate fight.
