
The (CLL) presents unique courses not just for school leavers, but also for professionals and employees in various industries, and for those in search of new expertise to enhance their skills.

ZEGU student bags prestigious international accolade



Masters in Theology and Religion level 1.2 student Tears Conoro Garaneunga recently awarded the prestigious Arrupe Jesuit University Model United Nations (AJUMUN) Best Paper (under World Health Organisation) after a careful and calculated presentation on access to medical care in Zimbabwe.

AJUMUN is a model United Nations Annual Conference where students are given tasks before the conference day, various countries to represent. One then researches and writes a position paper on critical issues that are particular to that country but under a broader United Nations theme. The issues are categorised and discussed separately under the various United Nations forums like WHO, UNHCR, WTO, and UNICEF.

The ZEGU student was assigned the task of being a delegate of Zimbabwe under the World Health Organisation (WHO) and was wrestling with the question: " Ensuring Equitable and Efficient Access to medical care during disease outbreaks in rural communities: A Case of Zimbabwe.

Students were asked to present their position papers in 5 minutes and then required to respond to questions and interrogations from all delegates present. According to Garaneunga, the accolade has ignited an inner need within himself to go the extra mile in ensuring that his contribution to humanity aids development.

"It (the award) is an inspiration, an eye opener, and a knock on the door demanding that I step out more and begin to contribute holistically to the well-being of humanity.

"It became clear to me that success is not success unless it impacts humanity positively... and I have potential," he said.

However, Garaneunga paid tribute to ZEGU citing, "Diligence, boldness, edge acquisition, and values that I have learnt and experienced at ZEGU came to the fore and were my arsenal at this conference, and they indeed brought the success home," he added.

Over 28 countries were represented at the two (2) day conference which ran in mid-March at Arrupe Jes-University, in Harare.















Youths implored to shun drugs



n its efforts to create a campus community that prioritizes the health and safety of all its members, the Zimbabwe Ezekiel Guti University (ZEGU) successfully held a Drug and Substance Abuse Campaign at the Bindura campus, where scores of students participated.

multi-faceted The campaign saw students marching across campus, while there was also a segment for sensitization, through guest speakers in the hope of equipping students with the knowledge and resources to make informed decisions about their health and well-being.

services Counselling support groups for students struggling with addiction were availed, while confidentiality was prioritised to do away with unwanted cropping up of stigmatization.

statement released by the University read, "By raising awareness and promot-

open conversations about mental health and substance abuse, we aim to break down the stigma surrounding these issues encourage students to seek help when needed.

"Our ultimate goal is to foster a campus environment where students feel supported and empowered to take control of their well-being. With the collective efforts of students, faculty, and staff, we can create a culture of wellness and resilience at the Zimbabwe Ezekiel Guti University.

"Together, we can make a positive impact on the lives of our communimembers and create a brighter future for all."

The Anti-Drug Campaign was hosted by ZEGU in partnership with SAYWHAT Zimbabwe and the Zimbabwe National Family Planning Council (ZNFPC).The Zimbabwe Civil Liberties and Drug Network reports that alcohol,

drugs, and other substances abused in order of consumption is as follows: cannabis (67%); cough syrup (47%); crystal meth (36%); illegal alcohol (31%); pharmaceuticals (13%); crack (3%); cocaine powder (3%); and heroin (2%).

EGU's ability to develop **Quality Assessment Tools** received a major boost as two (2) department chairpersons participated in the highly rated National Multiplication Training (NTM), a quality assurance workshop held at the Midlands State University (MSU), where 8 Universities were represented, recently.

ZEGU was represented by Gerry Mhlanga, a PHD student, who is also the Chairperson in the Department of Curriculum and Educational Philosophy, while Gift Manhimanzi, who holds qualifications in

Mcom Applied, Accounting, Bcom Accounting, Diploma in Education, and is also a PHD student, is the Chairperson for the Department of Accounting, Finance and Human Capital Management, respectfully.

Training of University chairpersons, who are often dubbed "backbone of any university" will also assist in the formulation and implementation of quality assurance systems. The NTM - a quality assurance workshop for University chairpersons - is funded by the German Academic exchange service in partnership with MSU.

Objectives:


- To analyze the ethical challenges and dilemmas faced by African political leaders and institutions in promoting sustainable development.

The Chapters should be developed in line with the below mentioned Key Sub-Themes.


- Ethical Leadership: Exploring the role of political leaders in upholding ethical principles, promoting integrity, and fostering trust among citizens.

NOTICE TO ALL STUDENTS 2024 SEMESTER 1 FEES PAYMENT STRUCTURE

May all students take note of the following information regarding the 2024 Semester 1 Fees Payment:-

- (a) The University Council at its meeting held on the 8th of December 2023, approved the recommendations of the Fess Revision Committee to Rationalise Semester Fees for all students across all Degree Programmes.
- (b) Students who are studying the same Degree Programme under the same mode of learning are now paying uniform Semester Fees irrespective of the Level and Semester (Except for Conventional students on Work-Related Learning).
- (c) The Rationalised Semester Fess per Degree Programme will be reflected on the individual students' portals and can also be accessed on the 2024 Semester 1 Fees Structure Schedule that is on the University Website.
- (d) All other conditions regarding the structure of payment of Semester Fees, Accommodation Fees, Conditions of accessing University Accommodation, Percentage of Semester Fees required for one to register and Late Registration Penalty fees remain at the same level that applied for the 2023 Semester 2.
